Refugee and migrant women and girls **AGENTS OF CHANGE**




Comprehensive care systems as a cornerstone of sustainable development



Buenos Aires Commitment, 2022:

*Promote systemic change in the approach to migration from a **gender, intersectoral, intercultural and human rights perspective** to highlight the contributions made to societies by migrant, displaced, refugee and asylum-seeking women...*



Recognize the role of women in migration, promote their empowerment and leadership, ensuring equal opportunities, creating **mechanisms for the response, protection and inclusion of migrant and refugee women**, and developing gender-sensitive migration and refugee policies and programs focused on human rights.

- Women and girls are rights holders, regardless of their migratory status and nationality
- Protection measures in accordance with international obligations
- Cross-cutting, gender-responsive and intersectoral response and prevention policies
- Trafficking is a transnational crime that requires transnational responses
- Guarantee the labour rights of migrant women and protect girls from labour exploitation, particularly in international care circuits
- Zero tolerance for corruption and complicity of public officials with traffickers and those who abuse authority, harassment and sexual exploitation
